Commonwealth vs. Harman (10/14/2024)—Judge Nancy L. Butts Criminal: Appeal; denial of motion to reinstate appeal rights nunc pro tunc treated as post conviction relief act petition; timeliness; sole means of obtaining collateral relief in criminal cases; requirement to appoint counsel for untimely petition; claim previously litigated or waived; factual allegations of after discovered evidence; dismissal without hearing where court lacks jurisdiction to hear the claim. # Lawson vs. Pennsylvania College of Technology (12/26/2024)— Judge Eric R. Linhardt

Civil: Motion for class certification; claim for reimbursement of tuition and fees paid for college students in light of move to remote learning during COVID-19 pandemic; standards applicable to class certification; inclusion of non-students, who may have paid costs for students, in a class where such persons cannot be identified and had no contract with college; determination of commonality, without necessity to establish the merits of the case; adjustment of classes after discovery to address differences in a particular student's experience; student demonstrating typicality, in that his overall position on common issues is sufficiently aligned with that of absent class members; lack of conflict of interest between interests of proposed class representative and those of the persons whom he seeks to represent; need for discovery to determine whether common questions of law and fact predominate over individual questions; risk of inconsistent or varying adjudications; appropriateness of forum; prohibitive cost to adjudicate claims individuality.
